A  
suspected gang of Tamil Tiger supporters has once again attacked the Sri  
Saddhatissa International Buddhist Centre popularly known as &ldquo;Kingsbury  
Buddhist Temple-London&rdquo; in the wee hours of Wednesday.

This attack by Tamil Tiger supporters caused damage to the glass windows,  
panels and the building. No one, including the residing monks, was injured and  
London Metropolitan Police were called immediately to the temple premises  
around 3.15 am.

This is the seventh (7th) time Kingsbury temple has come under physical attack  
and on numerous other occasions, suspects have stolen the Sri Lankan flag which  
is always displayed on the post in front of the temple, along with the British  
and Buddhist flags. Previous attacks caused severe damage to the building,  
glass windows and vehicles parked outside.
